

IASLT Conference 2026

IN-PERSON POSTER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES



1. Poster Format & Size:

- Orientation: Portrait (vertical)
- Maximum Dimensions: A0 (84.1 x 118.9 cm) Posters exceeding these dimensions will not fit on the display boards.
- Hook velcro dots will be supplied to authors onsite to mount their posters.
- Authors may use the provided poster template as a reference; however, this is not mandatory, and creative freedom is encouraged. We acknowledge that not all posters fit a single format.

2. Suggested Poster Layout:

- Title Author(s) and Affiliation(s)
- Introduction/Background
- Research questions/ Objectives
- Methods
- Results (figures and tables preferred over text)
- Conclusion/ Discussion
- Acknowledgments & Funding/ Conflict of Interest statement (if applicable) and References

3. Design:

- Use a clear, readable font
- Title font size should be at least 72 pt.

- Avoid excessive text and matt laminate

4. Poster Display Details

- You are welcome to display your poster on day 1 of the conference between 8.30 – 9.00 hours.
- All authors presenting in-person posters will be assigned a specific board number to mount their physical posters – these details will be made available to respective authors and help will be available at the registration desk to support poster display.
- Posters will be on display during both days of the conference.
- There will be a 15-minute session at the conclusion of each lunch break dedicated to in person poster presentations; authors are kindly encouraged to be physically present at their posters during this time.
- Posters will be available to review to all conference attendees on our IASLT 2026 Conference app and Ex Ordo platform.
- Posters must be removed and collected by the respective authors at the end of the 2nd day of conference (unclaimed posters will be binned to recycle).

General Policies

- All in person presenting authors/ attendees must be registered for the conference.
- Poster presentations must reflect the accepted abstract.
- All poster presentations are due to be uploaded on to Ex Ordo by **30/4/26**.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. Do I need to register for the conference to present my work?

Yes, all in-person presenting authors (oral and or in person/ virtual poster) must register for the conference.

2. Can someone else present on my behalf?

Yes, any co-author, registered for the conference is eligible to present.

3. What happens if I cannot attend after my abstract has been accepted?

Please update the RSVP link and inform the scientific committee as soon as possible.

4. Can I still display my poster, if I have accepted the RSVP, but am not able to attend in person?

Yes, your colleagues and friends who are registered for the conference can also mount your posters for you at the display board assigned to your submission during the designated hours.

5. Will abstracts be published?

Accepted abstracts will be available to access for all registered attendees on the IASLT Conference 2026 app, as well as on Ex Ordo. There will be no book of published abstracts for this conference.

6. What are the poster size requirements?

Poster dimensions are A0 portrait (84.1 x 118.9 cm or 841 mm x 1189 mm) as shared in the guidelines.

7. When should I set up and remove my poster?

Posters should be mounted during the assigned setup time (Day 1 8.30 – 9.00 am) and removed at the end of the conference (Day 2 4.30 pm onwards). Posters left after the removal deadline will be binned for recycling.

8. Will poster boards and materials be provided?

Yes. Poster boards and mounting materials (Velcro) will be provided at the venue.

9. Do I need to stand by my poster during the session?

There will be a 15-minute session at the conclusion of each lunch break dedicated to in person poster presentations. Authors are kindly encouraged to be physically present at their posters during this time, however this is not mandatory.

10. Can I include QR codes or digital materials on my poster?

Yes. Presenters are encouraged to include QR codes, links to datasets, or supplementary materials to facilitate discussion and dissemination.

11. Can I make changes to my abstract after acceptance?

Presentations must reflect the accepted abstract. Any major changes should be communicated to the conference organizers.

12. Are presentation awards available?

Yes, Best Oral Presentation and Best Poster Presentation will be awarded.
