IASLT Full Membership (MIASLT): A speech and language therapist who meets recency of practice requirements (i.e. 1,000 hours of clinical practice within the previous five (5) years) and who provides evidence of continuing professional development according to the standards and procedures of the IASLT, and has signed up to and agreed to be bound by the Code of Ethics of the IASLT. Newly qualified speech and language therapist may apply for New Graduate Membership of IASLT and may progress to Full Membership following (a) at least 12 months of clinical practice, that is, one full IASLT membership year (on average 1,550 hours) of which a minimum of 800 hours are closely supervised, and (b) a signed declaration by the service SLT manager confirming the required hours and indicating that the required competencies have been achieved.

Good Standing: To be in "Good Standing" with IASLT the member must have agreed to meet all the requirements for recognition for membership, to have agreed to abide by the IASLT Code Professional Conduct and Ethics, to meet the requirements for continuing professional development and must not be subject to any disciplinary investigation or sanction.
